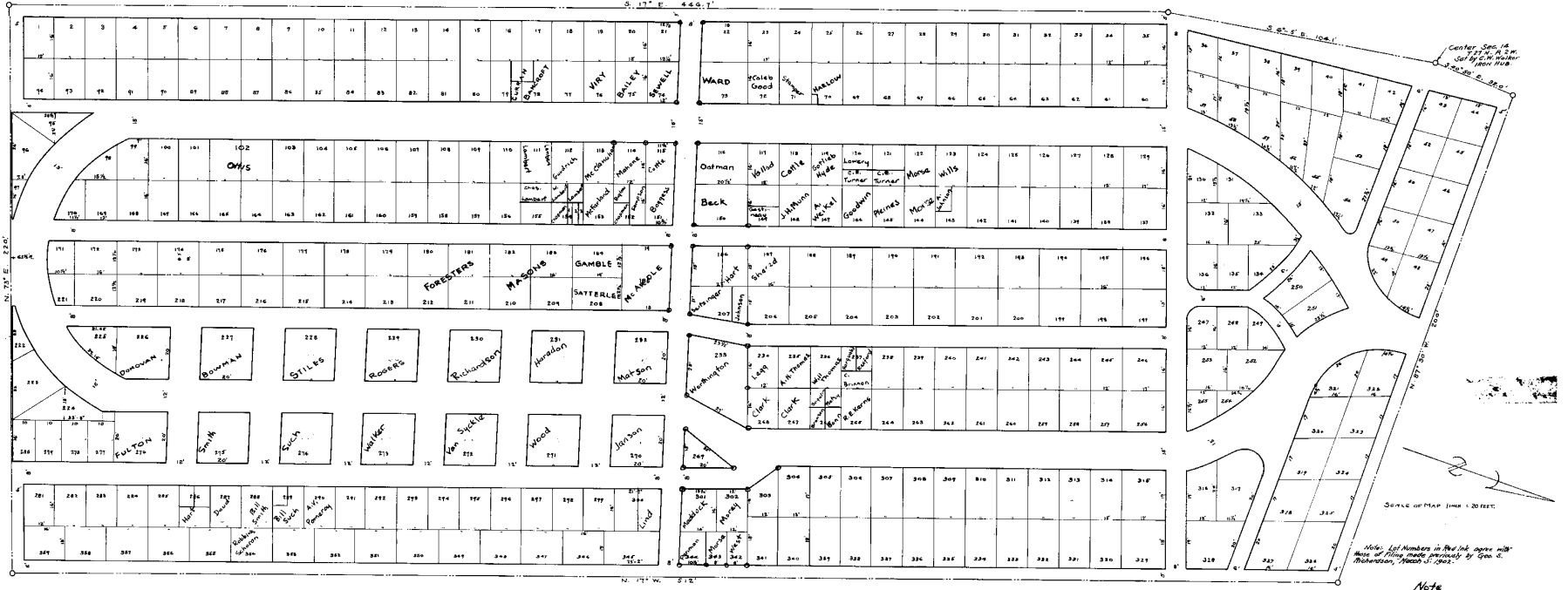

DESCRIPTION

The land upon which this Plat of "QUILCENE CEMETERY" is described as follows: Commencing at an iron hub set by C.M. Walker at the center of Section fourteen (14), Township twenty-seven (27) North, Range 2 West, Willamette Meridian, running thence South 6° of East 100.1 feet, thence South 17° East 442.3 feet, thence North 79° East 200 feet, thence North 17° West 422 feet, thence North 67° 30' West 200.2 feet, thence South 40° 50' East 32.0' to the place of beginning. (This Plat covers land acquired by Quilcene Cemetery as filed by Geo. W. Hutchinson, March 3, 1902, and conforms to that portion not recorded by order of Board of County Commissioners, June 1, 1909, in accordance with petition of the Foresters Cemetery Association filed in the Auditors Office of Jefferson County, Oct. 4, 1909.)
